Introduction

This collection consists of approximately 10 cm. of minutes, petitions, reports and publications of the Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada in connection with the United Presbyterian Synod in Scotland and its predecessor the Missionary Synod in connection with the United Associate Synod in Scotland. Related records may be found in the Personal Papers of William Proudfoot and J.J.A. Proudfoot.

The records were re-catalogued in February 1989 by Elspeth Reid.

This finding aid is listed as FA-PCUP.

Historical Sketch

The Missionary Synod of Canada in connection with the United Associate Synod of Scotland was formed in 1834 following the arrival in 1832 of ministers from the United Associate Synod of Scotland. The Rev. William Proudfoot and the Rev. Thomas Christie settled in London and Galt where they were joined by another seven missionaries by 1836. Following the disruption of the Church of Scotland in 1843 and the consequent disruption in Canada in 1844, the Missionary Synod approached the Presbyterian Church of Canada with proposals for a union in 1847 but these negotiations failed: the Missionary Synod was a voluntarist church whereas the Presbyterian Church of Canada maintained its claim to establishment for some years. Also in 1847 the Missionary Synod re-named itself as the Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada. In the 1850s negotiations on union with the Presbyterian Church of Canada were re-opened and in 1861 the two denominations united to form the Canada Presbyterian Church.
